A peer review award will recognize one manuscript annually (issues 3, 4, past year and 1, 2 of current award year) from the *Therapeutic Recreation Journal—Annual in Therapeutic Recreation* that exhibits outstanding literary contribution to the profession of therapeutic recreation/recreational therapy.

### Selection Considerations:

- Exhibits exemplary contribution to the knowledge base and or best practices through research, theory or evidence-based practice
- Exhibits exemplary adherence to research and writing protocols appropriate to the nature of the manuscript
- Presents innovative model, practice, and or resolution of need or issue that advances quality of recreational therapy interventions and services
- Presents justification, rationale, evidence from research and/or practice that advances recreational therapy outcomes providing evidence for the profession's contribution to health
- Facilitates advancement of the APIE-D process through improved accountability and efficacy
- Enhances the theoretical foundation of therapeutic recreation/recreational therapy practices
- Fosters practices that address a broad clientele spectrum contributing to interprofessional outcomes

Eligibility: Any manuscript published in Volume 52, numbers 3 and 4 (2018) and Volume 53 numbers 1 and 2 (2019) is automatically under consideration.

Review Process: Manuscripts will be nominated for consideration by the *TRJ* Editor-in Chief, *ATRA Annual* Editors, *TRJ* Editors, and *Annual* Associate Editors. The recipient will be chosen by a National Academy of Recreational Therapists Committee with the award presented during the ATRA Annual Conference.

\*(Anyone who has published in the four issues under consideration is ineligible to participate in the review process).
